

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Rainbow Butterfly

Art Project !!



Spring is the perfect time to for young children to explore and learn about the world around them.

Spring rainbows are an opportunity for them to learn colors and weather cycles. It's a time to share how plants grow. Bugs and bees and flowers! Tadpoles and baby animals and nesting birds! So much to explore and learn about! Get outdoors and explore! Use this time of year for fun learning adventures.

Activity Supplies:

- Coffee filters
- Clothes pins
- Pipe cleaners
- · Markers, crayons or watercolor paints

Directions:

- 1. Give each child a coffee filter to use as the butterfly wings.
- 2. Have children add color to the coffee filters with the crayons, markers or watercolor paints.
- 3. Fold the coffee filter in half and pinch together in the middle.
- 4. Slide the coffee filter into the clothes pin. The clothes pin is the butterfly's body.
- 5. Place the "neck" of the clothes pin in the middle of the pipe cleaner (antennae). Wrap the pipe cleaner around the neck and twist. Bend the pipe cleaners at the ends. You can draw eyes with a marker.
